#### Kaaradaiyaan Nombu

Monday, March 14, 2022

Kaaradaiyaan Nombu, or Savitri Vratham, is a Tamil observance in which the married woman prays for the well-being and long life for her husband. It is on the date of March 14, 2022, and the time of breaking fast and wear Saradu is 2:51 PM. It is observed on the particular day when the transition between the Tamil months of Maasi and Panguni takes place. Kaaraadai is the name of a unique neivedya (holy offering) prepared on this day. Nombu means Vratam or upavasam (fasting).

#### **Panguni Uttiram Day**

Friday, March 18, 2022

Panguni Uttiram (the day Uttara phalguni star occur in the Meena solar month) is one of the rare festivals that have significance for several deities in our temple. It is the Jayanti (day of incarnation) of Lord Ayyappa, the day Sri Valli married Lord Subrahmanya, the day that Goddess Mahalakshmi incarnated on Earth from the ocean of milk, and the day Goddess Parvathi, in the form of Kamakshi (or Gowri), married Lord Siva in Kanchipuram. It is only fitting that we celebrate this festival in our temple with all the religious grandeur so that our congregation can receive the blessings of many Gods and Goddesses.

#### **Annual and Lifetime Puja Sponsorship**

एकं सद्विप्रा बहुधा वदन्ति (Ekam Sat Vipraha Bahuda Vadanti) - Rig Veda (1.164.46) The truth is one; but the wise, talk of many.

The one God, in His/Her infinite compassion, takes on several forms (*Ishta Devata* – personal God) to fulfill the needs and aspirations of His/Her devotees. Sri Siva Vishnu Temple was founded on this principle of having several Ishta Devatas to meet the needs of a wide range of devotees. Worship of Ishta Devata and Kula Devata (Family Deity) is a special tradition to all Hindus. Supporting the rituals to various Deities according to one's choice and ability not only helps in maintaining this tradition, but it is recommended by the scriptures as one's duty. By supporting such activities in the temple, benefits accrue to the masses, and it sets a good example for future generations to follow.

Certain pujas are not conducive to be performed at home on a regular basis (ex. Siva Abhisheka, Padi Puja for Lord Ayyappa, or Butter Alankara for Lord Anjaneya) but are easily possible in a temple setting. Our scriptures place an emphasis on doing Pujas for the various deities on important days at the appropriate time (thithis); but due to schedules and other responsibilities, devotees may not be able to personally participate in these activities.

Supporting the worship of your Ishta Devatas on important days during the year has been made easy through the *Annual and Lifetime Sponsorship Program* at SSVT. Sponsorship of your favorite deities will ensure that Pujas are done on your behalf on special days regardless of if you are present on that day. These tax-deductible sponsorship donations are at a discount compared to sponsorship of individual programs during the course of the year. Annual sponsorships are valid for one year from the date of sponsorship. Lifetime sponsorships are valid in perpetuity and are deposited into the Sri Siva Vishnu Temple Endowment.

Sincere credit goes to our devotees who have followed our processes and protocols meticulously and have adhered to all recommended safety precautions without hesitation over the past two years.

While it's not completely over, the pandemic has also magnified many areas in our temple we need to address, including financial uncertainty. One of the best ways for surviving a crisis like this pandemic, and for the long-term sustenance of our temple is to have a robust endowment fund. Endowment funds, when planned and managed appropriately, sends a message of long-term stability, and creates financial independence. It can also offer the donor a sense of immortality as it extends the donor's contributions towards future generations. 
