The one God, in His/Her infinite compassion, takes on several forms (*Ishta Devata* – personal God) to fulfill the needs and aspirations of His/Her devotees. Sri Siva Vishnu Temple was founded on this principle of having several Ishta Devatas to meet the needs of a wide range of devotees. Worship of Ishta Devata and Kula Devata (Family Deity) is a special tradition to all Hindus. Supporting the rituals to various Deities according to one's choice and ability not only helps in maintaining this tradition, but it is recommended by the scriptures as one's duty. By supporting such activities in the temple, benefits accrue to the masses, and it sets a good example for future generations to follow.

Certain pujas are not conducive to be performed at home on a regular basis (ex. Siva Abhisheka, Padi Puja for Lord Ayyappa, or Butter Alankara for Lord Anjaneya) but are easily possible in a temple setting. Our scriptures place an emphasis on doing Pujas for the various deities on important days at the appropriate time (thithis); but due to schedules and other responsibilities, devotees may not be able to personally participate in these activities.

Supporting the worship of your Ishta Devatas on important days during the year has been made easy through the *Annual and Lifetime Sponsorship Program* at SSVT. Sponsorship of your favorite deities will ensure that Pujas are done on your behalf on special days regardless of if you are present on that day. These tax-deductible sponsorship donations are at a discount compared to sponsorship of individual programs during the course of the year. Annual sponsorships are valid for one year from the date of sponsorship. Lifetime sponsorships are valid in perpetuity and are deposited into the Sri Siva Vishnu Temple Endowment.

Udupi Puthige Math Swamiji visits SSVT

Shri Sugunendra Theertha Swamiji, Chief Pontiff of Udupi Sri Puthige Matha visited Sri Siva Vishn Temple on October 8, 2022. SSVT hosted this unique event for Swamiji where he accepted felicitations from various other temples and community organizations, gave a lucid and erudite lecture on Geeta's teachings for the current times, gave Geeta Lekhana japa deeksha to scores and conducted evening "Thottilu puja" in the Udupi madhva sampradaya way to Shri Krishna at the vasanta mantapam, to the delight of devotees.

Parama Poojya Swamiji is the Pradhaana Acharya (primary guide and preceptor) and nirneta or nirnaayaka (traditional architect of the puja protocols) of the maadhwa sampradaya paddhati followed for the aradhana of Sri Udupi Krishna at the temple. As the only sanyaasi visiting USA from the eight Udupi Ashta mataa-s (a system of eight monastries) serving Shri Krishna, he is the *de facto* guide to Shri Krishna deity modeled after the Udupi protocols at SSVT.

He will be ascending the paryaya peetha of Udupi in early 2024 and will hold "Sarvajna Peetha" of Shri Madhvacharya at the Udupi Krishna Temple for two years period. Sarvajna Peetha is the traditional seat of Sri Madhvacharya that each of the eight swamijis of the Udupi matha occupy in two-year terms by rotation. Incoming Paryaya swamiji tours all over India where the devotees reside. Shri 1008 Shri Sugunendra Theertha Swamiji is touring all the major cities in the US.

Swamiji continues to do enormous service to spread Sanatana Dharma among NRIs in US, Europe and Australia. He has established more than 10 Dharmic centers in US, Europe and Australia for this purpose. Shri Krishna Vrindavana temples operating outside of India with him as the resident Achaarya bring the flavor and spirit of Krishna Bhakthi world-over. He has worked with ISKCON and other Hindu organizations in spreading the message of Hindu Dharma. In addition to many other dharmic projects, he



had established Gita Mandira at Udupi, a magnificent temple to celebrate and propagate Gita.

On October 8th at SSVT, representatives of JSS organization, Rajdhani Mandhir, ISKCON, Kannada Koota and Vishwa Madhwa Sangha Swamiji offered their respects to Swamiji and recognized his continuous service to Hindu Dharma. JSS leaders highlighted the sense of harmony that Swamiji brings when interacting with monks and members of other Hindu religious schools. ISKCON temple leader pointed to the incident in 1976 when Srila Sri Prabhupada, the founder of ISKCON, visited Udupi before leaving for USA when he got blessings from the very same younger Swamiji holding his first Paryaaya peeta at that time. An amazing travel through time underscoring the leela of Shri Krishna who brings different people and beings together creating harmony and coalescence.



In his benedictory lecture, Swamiji pointed to the malice of modern technology that provides physical and material comfort while extracting a heavy toll on our inner peace and ability for reflection. He prescribed selected verses of Bhagavat Gita as a remedy to this and advised on the need of listening, studying, reflecting and meditating upon the eternal teachings of Shri Krishna. Subsequently, Pujya swamiji gave Gita Lekhana Deeksha to people who took a vow in his presence to write Gita 1-2 Shlokas a day and complete the writing in 1-2 years in any language script. The registered devotees were

given a notebook and a Gita book for this purpose. All these 'written japa' notebooks will be offered to Lord Krishna in Udupi from Jan 2024-2026 during Swamiji's paryaya duration. Swamiji visited the sanctum of Shri Krishna and offered upachaara-s to bhagwan. A solemn and peaceful "thottilu puja" followed - where Shri Krishna the Divine Child was brought to a cradle,

offered aradhana with veda mantras, stotras, melodious songs, sweet upachaaras to rest Him for the night. Swamiji, with love of a mother, tucked Him in with gentle rocking of the cradle. Devotees, trustees of the temple and the volunteers delightfully observed this traditional puja, and showed their respects to and received prasadam from Swamiji.

An ardent follower of Shri Krishna's universal message of harmony and equanimity, Shri Sugunendra Tirtha Swamiji is a Dharma Achaarya eliciting respect and honors from various Hindu traditions and other faiths. SSVT congregation was fortunate to have him in our midst at the temple even for a few hours on October 8th. This was a rare and once in a life-time event where a paryaya-ordained Udupi Krishna Mutt Swamiji himself came to our midst to initiate us for sadhana of written Japa - of Sri Krishna's Bhagavat Gita.

Austerities and Preparation required for the Pilgrimage to Ayyappa Sannidhi with Irumudi

Ayyappa Vratham

Devotees who wish to go to Sabarimala have to observe vratham (follow certain austerities) for one mandalam (41 days) to purify the mind and soul. On the first day of the month of Karthika/ Vrichikam (the middle of November), devotees wear the mudra maala and start the vratham.

Important austerities to be observed during vratham

- Observe Brahmacharyam during the vratham
- Always start the conversation with "Swami Saranam"
- Take shower twice daily and chant the names of Lord Ayyappa
- Control your temper and be kind to others
- Consume only freshly cooked vegetarian food
- Do not smoke or consume alcoholic beverages
- · Attend Puja either at the temple or wherever conducted
- Treat your body, mind and intellect as the abode of Ayyappa

How to prepare irumudi (in brief)

After performing Ayyappa Puja, fill the mudra coconut with melted ghee. If you are a Kanni Ayyappan or Kanni Maalikappuram (first timer), Guruswamy will help you to fill the mudra coconut with ghee. Mudra coconut and other Pujaitems must be placed in the front pocket of the lrumudi and the other two coconuts must be placed in the rear pocket. Always keep chanting the names of Lord Ayyappa while preparing the lrumudi. Never place the lrumudi on the floor; always place it on a towel and treat it with Bhakthi.



Student Work from the Family Dharma Class - Significance of Deepavali

Lighting Darkness

The word *Deepavali* can be directly defined as *deep (row)* and *avali (lights)* and is celebrated as "the Festival of Lights," known worldwide as *Diwali*. It blesses devotees with the promise of hope and inspiration and unites those who practice one of the four dharmic religions, *Sanatan Dharm, Jainism, Sikhism,* and *Buddhism,* to reflect on the connections that bind them to loved ones and to their divine light. Observers of Diwali can celebrate for as many as five nights: *Dhanawanti Thrayodashi, Narak Chaturdashi, Diwali, Govardhan Puja,* and *Bhai Dhooj.* Followers of Sanatan Dharm offer prayers to Sri Lakshmi, the Goddess of Wealth and Goddess of Light. Lamps are lit to welcome Her into the home. It is also believed that Sri Lakshmi only visits a clean home, so effort is made to make homes immaculate. While the Goddess Lakshmi on Diwali or at any time should seek "spiritual wealth" for the upkeep of our "inner light." It is also said that on this night, Lord Rama brought back with him Mother Sita, and the people of Ayodhya lit the streets up to welcome him home.

Dhanawanti Thrayodashi marks the first night of Diwali and it is also knowns as *Dhanteras*. A Diya is lit by a *tulsi* plant in homes. The *tulsi* plant is an herbal plant with medicinal properties. *Lord Dhanvantari* is regarded as the Hindu deity that represents the personality of Ayurveda, or the Science of Medicine that teaches how to heal from various diseases. Pujas to Goddess Lakshmi are also performed on this evening.

Following Dhanteras, the second night that is celebrated in some traditions is *Narak Chaturdashi*. On this day, the destructive Goddess form represented by Mother Kali destroys the demon *Narakasura*, ridding the world of sinful qualities and forces. On this day, around six o' clock in the evening, a *diya* is lit with four wicks and placed at the front entrance of homes with the door ajar. The four wicks symbolize hope that evil from all directions will stay away. Interestingly, there is a connection with this night and Halloween or "All Hallows Eve," which was held to ward off ghosts and bad spirits so that the coming year would bring good fortune to people. Similarly, the Diwali season ushers good energies into the homes of people, bringing them luck and good fortune in the year following it.

The third night is the main evening of Diwali where many diya lamps are lit around our homes. The front porch is decorated with *rangoli* (colorful rice) designs. Houses are abuzz with the excitement of cooking, especially with the preparation of sweets to offer and share. Diwali night may also mean a trip to the Temple where prayers and *Prasad* are offered. There is also singing of bhajans to Mother Lakshmi to celebrate the occasion. Family, friends, and all people in our tradition rejoice with each other. The atmosphere is joyful much as it was when Lord Rama returned to his home. *Govardhan Puja* is celebrated on the fourth night of Diwali. On this evening, we recall the story of Lord Krishna lifting the Govardhan Hill with the small finger of his left hand to protect the people from a torrential rainstorm. In fact, this story is told to remind us of the prowess of God. Lord Krishna used his left hand (typically the weaker hand) and his pinky finger (the smallest or weakest finger) to lift a gigantic mountain to protect his devotees. In our home, my mother makes a Prasad plat shaped like a mountain to represent this magnificent occasion in the life and story of Lord Krishna.

Finally, the last day of Diwali is the *Bhai Dhooj* occasion. It is a celebration of the relationship between a brother and a sister, like *Raksha Bandhan*. In households with siblings, the brother would aarti his sister and she does likewise to give and receive blessings. Gifts are exchanged as it is a day to reflect on what connects. Diwali symbolizes many things: light over dark, good over evil, happiness over sadness, and achieving harmony. As Hindus (and especially young Hindus), we must uphold reverence for this sacred period in our culture as we carry our own lights into the future.

A Review of the Hindustani Jugalbandi Concert held on September 25, 2022

Whether it was the fact that the evening began with a brief meditation or due to the beautiful blending of music with spirituality, the overall effect of this grand Jugalbandi at the Washington DC-based Sri Siva Vishnu Temple (SSVT) auditorium was a truly spiritual experience. In late September 2022, SSVT's cultural committee and the Heartfulness Institute, hosted a Hindustani classical flute-santoor Jugalbandi recital by Pt. Vivek Sonar and Pt. Madan Oak accompanied by Anirudh Changakoti on tabla. Flute-Santoor Jugalbandis are rare and innovative in Hindustani classical music; reminiscent of such concerts performed by their respective gurus Padmavibhushan Pt. Shiv Kumar Sharma and Padmavibhushan Pt. Hariprasad Chaurasia (of the Shiv-Hari fame) known for their melodic allure and the hypnotic effect. In a true reflection of the guru-shishya Parampara, these two scions gave an exhilarating and exalting performance.

Vivekji and Madanji commenced their recital with the melodious Raag Keeravani, unfurling highly nuanced 'alap' improvisations, while highlightling the important phrases of the raag, which were then followed by a euphonious 'jhor-jhala' executed with finesse and aplomb. Anirudhji's sonorous and resonant 'sangats' on the tabla were breathtaking. Exceptional 'sawaal-jawaab' between the instrumentalists and tabla player displayed by the instrumentalists who took turns to improvise exuberant sequences in a friendly competition with Anirudhji sculpting the gestalt with immaculate precision. The concert ended beautifully with Vivekji's rendition of the popular bhajan in raag mishr Khamaj -- "Vaishnav jan to' known for its lyrical fervor. The stamina and the creativity of these young artistes were remarkable. Whether you were an audience member well-versed in Indian classical music or a newcomer who just happened to like music, the effect was a mesmerizing and totally transformative evening, that left everyone wanting for more....


