Ayyappa Mandala Puja

Tuesday, December 27, 2022

The Ayyappa Shrine at Sri Siva Vishnu Temple is a blessing to those who live all over North America and would like to observe the Ayyappa Vratham; and climb the the holy 18 steps every year. Devotees who have been to Sabarimala in India consider SSVT as the "Sabarimala of the West."

Devotees climbing the 18 holy steps at SSVT follow the same rigiorus austerities of Ayyappa Vratham. The 2022-2023 Ayyappa Mandala Makarotsavam started on Thursday, November 17, 2022. Since then, hundreds of Ayyappa devotees from all over the country, observing Ayyappa Vratam, have already climbed the 18 Holy Steps with Irumudi to have darshan of Lord Ayyappa.

The Ayyappa Mandala Puja is on Tuesday, December 27, 2022. Due to the large number of Ayyappa devotees expected for the Mandala Puja, the Irumudi preparation at the temple will start at 7:00 AM to 8:30 AM, and the trek and climbing of the 18 Holy Steps is planned from 8:30 AM to 9:00 AM followed by Nirmalya Darsanam, Abhisheka, Mandala Puja Archana, Deeparadhana and Anandana by devotees.

The evening session will include Bhajans, Sahasranama Stotra, Deeparadhana, Athazha Puja, Seeveli with Thalapoli, Bhasmabhisheka, Harivarasnam.

2023 New Year's Day Celebration

Sunday, January 1, 2023

The temple will be open from 7:00 AM to 9:00 PM on Sunday, January 1, 2023. To minimize waiting times for all devotees, all archanas will be done in batches. Due to the expected heavy traffic expected, devotees are requested to have car pujas performed the day before or day after - no car pujas will be honored the whole day. Special Archanas to all Utsava Deities will be performed every hour for a special sponsorship of \$51.

Devotees may also sponsor all abhishekas that day, Utsava Deity Archana, and Archana to any two Ishta Devatas (Deities of their choice) for a sponsorship of \$151.

Vaikuntha Ekadashi Celebration

Sunday, January 1 - Monday, January 2, 2023

Vaikuntha Ekadashi is one of the most important Ekadashis of the year. On this day, the traditional practice is for devotees to enter the Vaikuntha Dwaara (special gate to Vaikuntha) of temples. This is a symbolic event, that signifies the belief that the devotee can be closer to God, and by observing special sadhanas such as fasting and remembering God on Vaikuntha Ekadashi. In tune with this tradition, SSVT offers an opportunity for all devotees to have Sameepa Darshanam (seeing the Lord at a close distance), by allowing devotees to climb the steps leading to the Ananthapadmanabha shrine during this special day. This Sameepa Darshanam will be available ONLY on Vaikuntha Ekadashi day, Monday, Jan-

Annual and Lifetime Puja Sponsorship

एकं सद्विप्रा बहुधा वदन्ति (Ekam Sat Vipraha Bahuda Vadanti) - Rig Veda (1.164.46) The truth is one; but the wise, talk of many.

The one God, in His/Her infinite compassion, takes on several forms (*Ishta Devata* – personal God) to fulfill the needs and aspirations of His/Her devotees. Sri Siva Vishnu Temple was founded on this principle of having several Ishta Devatas to meet the needs of a wide range of devotees. Worship of Ishta Devata and Kula Devata (Family Deity) is a special tradition to all Hindus. Supporting the rituals to various Deities according to one's choice and ability not only helps in maintaining this tradition, but it is recommended by the scriptures as one's duty. By supporting such activities in the temple, benefits accrue to the masses, and it sets a good example for future generations to follow.

Certain pujas are not conducive to be performed at home on a regular basis (ex. Siva Abhisheka, Padi Puja for Lord Ayyappa, or Butter Alankara for Lord Anjaneya) but are easily possible in a temple setting. Our scriptures place an emphasis on doing Pujas for the various deities on important days at the appropriate time (thithis); but due to schedules and other responsibilities, devotees may not be able to personally participate in these activities.

Supporting the worship of your Ishta Devatas on important days during the year has been made easy through the *Annual and Lifetime Sponsorship Program* at SSVT. Sponsorship of your favorite deities will ensure that Pujas are done on your behalf on special days regardless of if you are present on that day. These tax-deductible sponsorship donations are at a discount compared to sponsorship of individual programs during the course of the year. Annual sponsorships are valid for one year from the date of sponsorship. Lifetime sponsorships are valid in perpetuity and are deposited into the Sri Siva Vishnu Temple Endowment.

AYYAPPA MANDALA - MAKAROTSAVAM

Austerities and Preparation required for the Pilgrimage to Ayyappa Sannidhi with Irumudi

Ayyappa Vratham

Devotees who wish to go to Sabarimala have to observe vratham (follow certain austerities) for one mandalam (41 days) to purify the mind and soul. On the first day of the month of Karthika/Vrichikam (the middle of November), devotees wear the mudra maala and start the vratham.

"SWAMIYE SARANAM AYYAPPA"

Important austerities to be observed during vratham

- · Observe Brahmacharyam during the vratham
- Always start the conversation with "Swami Saranam"
- Take shower twice daily and chant the names of Lord Ayyappa
- Control your temper and be kind to others
- · Consume only freshly cooked vegetarian food
- Do not smoke or consume alcoholic beverages
- Attend Puja either at the temple or wherever conducted
- Treat your body, mind and intellect as the abode of Ayyappa

How to prepare irumudi (in brief)

After performing Ayyappa Puja, fill the mudra coconut with melted ghee. If you are a Kanni Ayyappan or Kanni Maalikappuram (first timer), Guruswamy will help you to fill the mudra coconut with ghee. Mudra coconut and other Pujaitems must be placed in the front pocket of the Irumudi and the other two coconuts must be placed in the rear pocket. Always keep chanting the names of Lord Ayyappa while preparing the Irumudi. Never place the Irumudi on the floor; always place it on a towel and treat it with Bhakthi.

Spirituality in Indian Classical Music and Dance

November 12, 2022

All good things start with a good idea. The idea was to create a program where two of our devotee committees could work together. This set up for a challenge for the Education and Cultural Committees — to work together in making a creative, thoughtfully developed program to complement our competencies.

The Education Committee mostly serves our devotees through classes (including the Family Dharma Class, Yoga, SAT Prep, and others) and discourses on Dharma and Spirituality. The Cultural Committee Music and Dance – celebrating all the festivals with performances. Combining the two, the topic of the event was titled "Spirituality in Indian Classical Music and Dance."

The Education Committee took the lead and put in a lot of work in planning the event. Artists representing the different genres were identified by both Committees and schedules were worked out. The topics for the panel discussions were finalized.

On November 12, 2022, the event started at 11 am with a welcome address by the Temple Chairperson, Murali Elambilan. The first program was an energetic presentation on Namasamkeertanam by Vignesh Subramaniam and his young students. Vignesh spoke about how this form of music would be held for several days with a large group of people. He highlighted the spiritual aspects of this form of music.

The next program was a Kathak dance performance by Purvi Bhatt and her students. Purvi highlighted the evolution of the dance form over centuries and demonstrated it using different pieces. She also spoke about the influences of different time periods on the dance form.



This was followed by a presentation on Bharathanatyam by Vidya Shankaranarayanan.



Next was a Panel Discussion on Expression & Experience of Spirituality in Indian Performing Arts. Aparna Ramaswamy set the tone for the discussion by suggesting some ideas. The discussion was moderated by Lakshmi Swaminathan. The other panelists were J. Shivakumar, Vidya Shankaranarayanan and Purvi Bhat. The panelists spoke about their experiences of spirituality with their art forms.

After a quick break, it was the turn of J Shivakumar to present 'Raga & Bhakti in Carnatic Music'.

After this was the presentation on 'Rasa: Essence of Emotion' in Kuchupudi by Anuradha Nehru and her student.

This was followed by an instrumental presentation on Veena by Hari Kapiyoor on 'Bhavam in Music through Ragam and Laya'. Hari spoke about how based on the lyrics and context of the song, the appropriate raga and pace (Laya) are very important. He demonstrated them with examples.

It was time for the second panel discussion of the day. Once again, Aparna Ramaswamy set the tone for the discussion as before and this time the moderator was Gokul Chandramouli. The other panelists were Lisa Santhanam, Anuradha Nehru and Sudeshna Basu.

Spirituality in Indian Classical Music and Dance

November 12, 2022

Following the panel discussion, Lisa Santhanam and her student gave an excellent presentation on the topic of Bhakti in Odissi.

The day concluded with a soulful presentation on Hindustani and Rabindra Sangeet by Sudeshna Basu.

One of the families that stayed through the event said that the information presented through the day was priceless. The video of the event on YouTube has been garnering a steady stream of viewers. In all, a unique and successful event was held under the banner of two SSVT Committees.
