Sri Siva Vishnu Temple wishes all devotees and volunteers a happy, healthy and prosperous New Year! *COVID-19 Temple Operations:* As of publication, normal temple hours have resumed. As a precautionary measure, devotees are encouraged to continue wearing face masks, but it is not mandatory. The temple kitchen remains open to devotees.

The temple will be open from 7:00 AM to 9:00 PM on Sunday, January 1, 2023. To minimize waiting times for all devotees, all archanas will be done in batches. Due to the expected heavy traffic expected, devotees are requested to have car pujas performed the day before or day after - no car pujas will be honored the whole day. Special Archanas to all Utsava Deities will be performed every hour for a special sponsorship of \$51.

Devotees may also sponsor all abhishekas that day, Utsava Deity Archana, and Archana to any two Ishta Devatas (Deities of their choice) for a sponsorship of \$151.

#### Vaikuntha Ekadashi Celebration

Sunday, January 1 - Monday, January 2, 2023

Vaikuntha Ekadashi is one of the most important Ekadashis of the year. On this day, the traditional practice is for devotees to enter the Vaikuntha Dwaara (special gate to Vaikuntha) of temples. This is a symbolic event, that signifies the belief that the devotee can be closer to God, and by observing special sadhanas such as fasting and remembering God on Vaikuntha Ekadashi. In tune with this tradition, SSVT offers an opportunity for all devotees to have Sameepa Darshanam (seeing the Lord at a close distance), by allowing devotees to climb the steps leading to the Ananthapadmanabha shrine during this special day. This Sameepa Darshanam will be available ONLY on Vaikuntha Ekadashi day, Monday, January 2, 2023. We request all devotees to partcipate in this special opportunity, and to have the special darshanam of the Lord on

that day.

#### **Annual and Lifetime Puja Sponsorship**

एकं सद्विप्रा बहुधा वदन्ति (Ekam Sat Vipraha Bahuda Vadanti) - Rig Veda (1.164.46) The truth is one; but the wise, talk of many.

The one God, in His/Her infinite compassion, takes on several forms (*Ishta Devata* – personal God) to fulfill the needs and aspirations of His/Her devotees. Sri Siva Vishnu Temple was founded on this principle of having several Ishta Devatas to meet the needs of a wide range of devotees. Worship of Ishta Devata and Kula Devata (Family Deity) is a special tradition to all Hindus. Supporting the rituals to various Deities according to one's choice and ability not only helps in maintaining this tradition, but it is recommended by the scriptures as one's duty. By supporting such activities in the temple, benefits accrue to the masses, and it sets a good example for future generations to follow.

Certain pujas are not conducive to be performed at home on a regular basis (ex. Siva Abhisheka, Padi Puja for Lord Ayyappa, or Butter Alankara for Lord Anjaneya) but are easily possible in a temple setting. Our scriptures place an emphasis on doing Pujas for the various deities on important days at the appropriate time (thithis); but due to schedules and other responsibilities, devotees may not be able to personally participate in these activities.

Supporting the worship of your Ishta Devatas on important days during the year has been made easy through the *Annual and Lifetime Sponsorship Program* at SSVT. Sponsorship of your favorite deities will ensure that Pujas are done on your behalf on special days regardless of if you are present on that day. These tax-deductible sponsorship donations are at a discount compared to sponsorship of individual programs during the course of the year. Annual sponsorships are valid for one year from the date of sponsorship. Lifetime sponsorships are valid in perpetuity and are deposited into the Sri Siva Vishnu Temple Endowment.

You have helped build one of the largest temples in the United States; now consider extending the same generosity to ensure its future. Sponsor an Ishta Deity for a year, or in perpetuity and preserve Dharma today and for the future.

While we made tremendous progress in achieving our goals – improving devotee satisfaction, move forward on major capital projects, and complete pending projects – we still have more to do, including finishing the Sai Aradhana Center (SAC) Our temple has been in existence for over 40 years. It started in a house called 'Balalaya' (located on the left as soon as your turn into our driveway and parking lot.) We are working to turn that house in to the SAC – to welcome many more devotees to our

The temple has grown to the current architectural marvel by the sheer hard work and dedication of several thousands of volunteers and our staff members. I take this opportunity to salute all our volunteers and staff including our founder trustees; without their initiative, our temple wouldn't be what it is today. SSVT serves the needs of its 25,000 plus congregation in many ways. #### 2022 Chairperson's Report

One of the special features of our temple is that it has a well-established governance structure that consists of the General Council (GC), Governance Board (GB), and a 17-member Board of Trustees (BOT). There are several volunteer-ran operational committees and task forces to carry out the temple functions, that are overseen by the BOT. The roles, and responsibilities of the governance structure is well guided by SSVT Deed of Trust, Bylaws, Operations Manual, and any amendments thereto. The financials are subject to statutory financial audit every year. All of these efforts ensures complete transparency and compliance in decision making.

2022 was a phenomenal year for Sri Siva Vishnu Temple as we moved forward past the COVID-19 pandemic strongly in all fronts. In fact, the lessons we learned from the pandemic period better prepared us to meet any kind of strategic challenges. While prioritizing cost management, our main focus for 2022 was to always to provide the best devotee experience for all, with an emphasis on devotee satisfaction and the most authentic religious services.

#### Mahotsavam

The Sri Rama Bhakti Samrajya Mahotsavam was celebrated from Saturday, August 6 through Sunday, August 14, 2022. Several religious, educational, and cultural events for Sri Rama were conducted as part of the Mahotsavam, including devotee participatory pujas in the six-weekends leading up to the nine-day mahotsavam in August.

Pujas on all nine days were performed under the guidance of our Pradhana Vaishnava Acharya Sri Koti Ramaswarupa Raghavacharyulu, Chief Priest, Bhadrachalam Sri Sita Ramachandra Temple in Telangana along with Sri Vishnu Vardhan, another learned Acharya from India, and our Temple Acharyas. The Mahotsavam was concluded with the celebration of Rama Pattaabhishekam on Sunday, August 14, 2022.

Additionally, Srimad Valmiki Ramayana Parayanam was chanted in the mornings, and U. Ve. Sri Dushyanth Sridhar presented discourses in the evening on Ramayanam in English on all nine days of the Mahotsavam.

The Mahotsavam was preceded by a well-attended Marquee concert by Padma Bhushan Smt. Sudha Raghunathan in July.

Monthly Ayyappa Padi Puja

As part of the 25th anniversary of Ayyappa Kumbhabhishekam, Panchaloha Kavacham for the Holy 18 steps was adorned in November 2021. As an endeavor to provide the most authentic service and true to our reputation as the "Sabarimala of the West," we started offering monthly padi puja and irumudi abhishekam starting from April 2022 with the exception of winter months. We look forward to resuming this service in 2023.

Consular Camp @ SSVT

On November 19th, The Embassy of India, Washington DC in association with Sri Siva Vishnu Temple and VFS Global, hosted a Consular Camp (first ever in the DC region) in our auditorium. Applicants were able to have their completed applications verified and submitted in person for Passport, OCI, Renunciation, Police Clearance Certificate, Visa, and GEP applications. The response we received was overwhelming and we are planning to make this an annual event benefiting several of our devotees and others residing in this area.

**Capital Projects** 

From the beginning of 2022, we vigorously pursued several pending projects that had been suspended due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and we made some significant progress. A contract for the long pending HVAC replacement project was awarded and finalized with Protec Construction, Inc. after a rigorous vetting process. The project is anticipated to be completed by the end of 2023. The Board of Trustees has decided to upgrade the main level

flooring with granite tiles to create a welcoming and aesthetically pleasing atmosphere for our devotees. The project was awarded to the vendor Elegant Granites after strictly following the processes and procedures laid out by the BOT. These two projects are projected to cost about \$2.2 million for the temple over the next 12 months.

Earlier in the year we completed the much-awaited LED lighting project. All lighting throughout the temple is now LED - and we have saved on our utilities bills from this effort. Late last summer, we installed a children's playground that offers a fun, interactive environment for our children between the ages of 5 to 12 years old to connect with each other. Lastly, we also resurfaced our temple parking lots and driveways in mid-November.

**Employee Children's Education Fund** 

Like any other organization, our employees are the backbone of our temple. As part of our efforts to keep the employee morale high, we created the "Employee Children Education Fund" to help the children of our full-time staff to defray some of the tuition fees during their undergraduate studies. The policies and procedures for determining eligibility and disbursement of funds was approved by the Board of Trustees. This fund is intended only for this specific purpose, and I am glad to report that we have processed student applications this year and disbursed funds. This will be an ongoing effort that will be sustained by donations - disbursements will only occur as long as there are funds.

Acknowledgments

I am thankful to many people for a successful year. Our temple is blessed with thousands of faithful devotees who offer their best to sustain and support the growth of this temple. We also have hundreds of selfless and committed volunteers who always go above and beyond to support the temple's needs. Our Pradhana Acharyas and priests help us to provide the best and most authentic religious services for the devotees. I am grateful as well for the administrative staff members and cooks who are invaluable in keeping our temple and kitchen running every day. Lastly, I would like to express my immense gratitude to the tireless Board of Trustees and the General Council members for their excellent support and guidance during this year. I look forward to their continued support in the new year!

#### **2022 Operations Report**

Raji Ramesh, Vice Chairperson of Operations

Firstly, I would like to thank the temple staff, volunteers, and committee members for their hard work to help our temple ease back into normal operations in this near post-COVID era. It was a pleasure to work with a dedicated group of people who have our temple in their best interests at all times. Devotees have resumed visiting our temple for pujas and prayers and to seek solace from our temple. In-person cultural, and educational activities have resumed, with the temple seeing hundreds of people week after week.

On the religious services front, we organized and celebrated all the pujas and festivities with great pomp and circumstance. Devotees came in the thousands for Sivarathri, Ugadi, Tamil & Tulu New Year, Sri Venkateshwara Brahmotsavam, Siva Brahmotsavam, Rama Mahotsavam, Onam, Navarathri, Deepavali, and Ayyappa Mandala season. Under the auspicious guidance of our Pradhana Vaishnava Acharya Sri Ramakoti Swaroopa from Bhadrachalam, we held a successful nine-day Rama Mahotsavam which culminated with a Rama Pattaabhishekam and procession around the temple. It was attended by hundreds of devotees who received the special blessings during the Mahotsavam. Navarathri celebrations included the grand 11 step Golu and 108 Vastram alankara for the deities. Devotees thronged to see the beautiful decorations. Diwali celebrations showcased the grand fireworks that enthralled hundreds of devotees.

We were fortunate and blessed to have visits from various religious leaders including Mahamahopadhyaya Bhadreshdas

Swami - a Sanskrit scholar, and an ordained Swami of the BAPS Swaminarayan Sanstha and Shri Sugunendra Theertha Swamiji of Puthige Matha, Udupi. Various Religious discourses were held including: Sri Vishnu Sahasranama Pravachanam in Telugu By Brahma Sri Samavedam Shanmukha Sarma garu; Ramayana Navaham by Sri. Dushyanth Sridhar; and Yoga and meditation sessions by Swami Mukundananda.

The Cultural Committee organized and held various carnatic and Hindustani artists throughout the year. These included Padma Bhushan Sudha Raghunatahan, Vidhushi Amritha Murali, and Gayathri Venkataraghavan. The Education Committee resumed many in-person classes to a hybrid format, including Family Dharma Class, Yoga class, and SAT Prep class. These programs were well attended and we received a positive reception from our devotees. A first for this year was a cross-collaboration program between the Education Committee and Cultural Committee - Spirituality in Indian Classical Music and Dance, which was well received.

On the Temple infrastructure and staff housing maintenance side both routine and ad-hoc maintenance activities were completed. Three staff houses were remodeled and made more energy efficient. This is an ongoing effort which will continue into 2023 for the remaining staff houses. LED lighting was installed throughout the temple. Efforts are underway to change the lighting at the staff housing as well to LED. Air duct cleaning was completed for the temple and staff housing. The children's playground was cleaned up and new playground equipment was installed for families to enjoy the space in front of the temple. The temple parking lot and driveway surrounding the immediate temple was resurfaced, and the concrete sidewalks were leveled and repaired to improve pedestrian safety. Leaks from the roof and the outer prakaara were addressed by professional assistance. Annual maintenance and certification of our elevator, kitchen, and fire safety was conducted. The temple gardens continue to be maintained by a devoted group of volunteers.

The Operations Committee has met frequently to plan for future programs, and address any concerns. The Executive Committee, and members of the BOT have continually met with the priests to discuss upcoming programs, address concerns and maintain an open communication with everyone.

I sincerely thank the devotee committee coordinators for their steadfast support of our temple operations. Along with their committee members, they volunteer their time without anything in return. I am humbled by the selfless dedication our volunteers have for our temple and I look forward to serving as our Vice Chairperson of Operations in the new year!

#### 2022 Human Resources & Policy Report

Padma Tipirneni, Vice Chairperson of Human Resources & Policy

As part of a revision to the Temple Bylaws (that was ratified by the General Council in 2021), the role of the Vice Chairperson of Policy was revised to include Human Resources and Policy. The reason behind this change was to accommodate the growing needs of employee related issues and streamlining the process and procedures to address them delicately while maintaining high employee morale.

From the HR & Policy perspective this year has been a very fruitful year. All changes were discussed at length with numerous stakeholders including staff and approved by the BOT. This year, we moved all staff to a Kaiser Permanente group policy which was beneficial to both staff and the temple from a cost savings perspective.

We also updated the employee handbook, employee contracts, and expanded their health benefits to include dental and vision.

We updated the leave policy and provided clarity on the bereavement policy to include extended family. Also travel related to be reavement has been reviewed and revised. All these policy changes were discussed with all staff and put in action with their concurrence and BOT approval.

A major change to the leave policy was aligning leave accrual to the calendar year instead of our fiscal year and ensure all federal holiday leaves are used during the calendar year. Staff are also limited in the amount of comp time and comp days they can carry over to the following calendar year.

A major policy accomplishment for 2022 was establishing a BOT led Salary Review Board to analyze the current compensation of all positions at the temple and ensure it meets or exceeds comparable positions at temples regionally and nationally. Led by Krishnaswamy Mama, myself, the Chairperson and two other Trustees, we collected input from the EC, employees, advisors, former trustees, as well as leadership from other temples on their practices regarding comp time, sambhavana, and other key metrics. The aim of this review was to keep things simple and uniform and maintain parity amongst all employees. It established a fixed percentage annual increase along with a small merit-based percentage to avoid subjective and arbitrary decisions. The policy also addresses anniversary-based increases. The Salary Review Board recommendations were discussed and approved by the BOT with an effective date of July 1, 2022. Going forward, this revised salary structure will be adhered to in the hiring process for any employee and can only be changed after BOT approval.

Other policy accomplishments include formalizing donations to the temple in-cash or in-kind: anything donated to the temple is temple property at the point of donation. Conditions cannot be set with any donation; the temple cannot accept the donation if strings are attached. Another policy accomplishment is establishing the policies and guidelines for the Employee Children's Education Fund. The BOT instituted this fund with the sole objective to support the children of all SSVT full time staff for their higher education. The need was realized when children of a few SSVT Employees started attending College and needed financial assistance. This policy document defines the scope and eligibility for receiving this scholarship.

With the increase in devotee attendance, we also brought on part-time staff to assist with procurement and inventory management, as well as manage the front desk during the week. We also hired two new cooks to support our kitchen prasadams preparation. Additional positions across the temple will be filled as the need arises and with BOT approval – to help improve devotee services. I thank the Board of Trustees, our temple volunteers and our priests and staff for their continued support to help our temple serve all devotees. I look forward to what is to come in the coming year for our temple.

#### 2022 Treasurer's Report


SSVT has made significant strides throughout 2022 to return to normalcy coming off of the COVID-19 pandemic. Major religious, cultural, and educational programs were well attended throughout the year. Many thanks to our devotees and donors for their contributions throughout the year.

Following a trend from September 2021, donations and request for religious services has continued to increase, resulting in a revenue growth rate that is comparable to pre-pandemic numbers. While most of the cost management measures that were implemented in the last couple of years remains in place, we are committed to invest selectively in areas where it is necessary to meet the needs of devotee services and long-term interest of the temple.

#### Revenue:

Revenues have continued steady increase and are now comparable

to pre-pandemic levels. As shown in the chart below, of the three primary revenue sources, donations make up 36% of the revenue while religious services and prasadam donations make up 30% each.



**Expenses:** 

While we have continued the strong cost management steps implemented by the BOT since the start of the pandemic, we have started to invest selectively in some areas. These include interior painting, LED lighting, equipment/ground maintenance contracts, temple repair, priests housing repair, resurfacing the temple parking lot and driveways and the addition of children playground equipment. With increased revenue and managed costs, for each of the month thru November this year, we have had positive net operating revenue.



#### **Endowment:**

This year, the Finance Committee recommended the temple make a 5% monthly contribution of the gross operating revenue to our endowment and the BOT approved this measure. We started these monthly contributions at the start of FY2023. As of November month-end, the endowment balances are relatively the same as compared to the prior year, though additional contributions included 5% monthly contribution and the life time puja sponsor-ships contributions to the endowment fund.

#### **Capital Projects and Major Initiatives:**

The following projects are in different stages of planning and implementation. The BOT is committed to taking these projects to completion to meet expectations from our devotees.

- HVAC Replacement (~\$1.6M): contractor selected, new equipment orders are in progress - project completion slated for end of 2023.
- Granite Flooring (\$~500k) contractor selected, finalizing the design, colors, and procuring the material - project com-

- pletion slated for mid-2023.
- 3. Temple Roof and Prakaara Repairs (\$~400k) Engineering Committee Review is in progress regarding next steps project completion slated for first half of 2023.
- 4. Sai Aradhana Center and Meditation Hall (SAC) (~\$500k) permits are in progress with Prince George's County.
- 5. Lot line Adjustments (~\$200k) dependent on SAC completion

I thank the BOT, and our donors - no amount is too small for our temple. Your contributions during the pandemic as well as sponsorship of our religious pujas help sustain our temple for the future. Thank you!

#### Austerities and Preparation required for the Pilgrimage to Ayyappa Sannidhi with Irumudi

#### **Ayyappa Vratham**

Devotees who wish to go to Sabarimala have to observe vratham (follow certain austerities) for one mandalam (41 days) to purify the mind and soul. On the first day of the month of Karthika/Vrichikam (the middle of November), devotees wear the mudra maala and start the vratham.

#### Important austerities to be observed during vratham

- · Observe Brahmacharyam during the vratham
- Always start the conversation with "Swami Saranam"
- Take shower twice daily and chant the names of Lord Ayyappa
- Control your temper and be kind to others
- · Consume only freshly cooked vegetarian food
- Do not smoke or consume alcoholic beverages
- Attend Puja either at the temple or wherever conducted
- Treat your body, mind and intellect as the abode of Ayyappa

#### How to prepare irumudi (in brief)

After performing Ayyappa Puja, fill the mudra coconut with melted ghee. If you are a Kanni Ayyappan or Kanni Maalikappuram (first timer), Guruswamy will help you to fill the mudra coconut with ghee. Mudra coconut and other Pujaitems must be placed in the front pocket of the Irumudi and the other two coconuts must be placed in the rear pocket. Always keep chanting the names of Lord Ayyappa while preparing the Irumudi. Never place the Irumudi on the floor; always place it on a towel and treat it with Bhakthi.



# Vaíkuntha Ekadashí

## Sunday January 1st to Monday January 2nd, 2023

Vaikuntha Ekadashi is the most important Ekadashi of the year. On this day, devotees walk through the Vaikuntha Dwaara (a special gate to Vaikuntha) of Temples.
