The one God, in His/Her infinite compassion, takes on several forms (*Ishta Devata* – personal God) to fulfill the needs and aspirations of His/Her devotees. Sri Siva Vishnu Temple was founded on this principle of having several Ishta Devatas to meet the needs of a wide range of devotees. Worship of Ishta Devata and Kula Devata (Family Deity) is a special tradition to all Hindus. Supporting the rituals to various Deities according to one's choice and ability not only helps in maintaining this tradition, but it is recommended by the scriptures as one's duty. By supporting such activities in the temple, benefits accrue to the masses, and it sets a good example for future generations to follow.

Certain pujas are not conducive to be performed at home on a regular basis (ex. Siva Abhisheka, Padi Puja for Lord Ayyappa, or Butter Alankara for Lord Anjaneya) but are easily possible in a temple setting. Our scriptures place an emphasis on doing Pujas for the various deities on important days at the appropriate time (thithis); but due to schedules and other responsibilities, devotees may not be able to personally participate in these activities.

Supporting the worship of your Ishta Devatas on important days during the year has been made easy through the *Annual and Lifetime Sponsorship Program* at SSVT. Sponsorship of your favorite deities will ensure that Pujas are done on your behalf on special days regardless of if you are present on that day. These tax-deductible sponsorship donations are at a discount compared to sponsorship of individual programs during the course of the year. Annual sponsorships are valid for one year from the date of sponsorship. Lifetime sponsorships are valid in perpetuity and are deposited into the Sri Siva Vishnu Temple Endowment.

Some entrances, common areas, and Sannidhis may be temporarily closed off as work will be completed in phases. We anticipate minimal disruption to our normal operations; all religious, cultural, and educational programs will take place as scheduled. Once complete, I hope the added vibrancy and beauty will please your Ishta Devata even more; and bless all of us with their choicest blessings.

Siva Brahmotsavam

According to both Shaiva and Vaishnava Agamas, a Brahmotsavam is considered to be the chief among the festivals conducted for the main deities of a temple. Legend says that Lord Brahma himself officiated the first utsavam to mitigate Indra's sins arising from a happenstance event. Since then, annual Brahmotsavams are carried out for both Slva and Vishnu to enable the devotees to wash away their sins and negativities. Even Lord Brahma and other Devas are said to visit such utsavams and bless the devotees. The word Brahma in Brahmotsavam, denotes the supreme Brahman - the absolute one. By performing the Brahmotsavam, the Jeevaathmas reach the Supreme Brahman in the simplest way. Siva Brahmotsavam concludes on Vaikasi Vishaaka nakshatra day this year (Friday, June 2), a special day for His Divine Son, Lord Subrahmanya.

Vaikasi Visakam Day

Friday, June 2, 2023

During the month of Vaikasi (Vrishabam) the Nakshatra Vishakam generally falls on the Full Moon day. This day signifies the birth of Lord Subrahmanya, the second son of Lord Siva. His mission was to save Earth from demons such as Soorapadman. He emerged as 6 sparks from the third eye of Siva, and passed through sky, wind, fire and the waters of Ganga, reached Earth, formless at first and finally acquiring form in a pond. His manifestation represents that the Almighty is comprised of the five elements. He is also known by many names including Lord Karthikeya and fondly as Muruga. Lord Murugan has six faces and because of that He is also known as Lord Arumugam. Due to His six faces Lord Murugan can see in East, West, North, South, Heaven and Patala (netherworld) simultaneously. Vaikasi Visakam is celebrated with much religious importance and fervor at the Arupadaiveedu of Lord Muruga or the six abodes of Lord Murugan in Tamil Nadu. These temples are the Pazhani Hill Temple, Thiruchendur Murugan Temple, Arulmigu Swaminatha Swami Temple, Thiruthani Murugan Temple, Sri Subramanya Temple at Pazhamudircholai, and Thiruparamkundram Subramanya Swamy Temple It is also celebrated in many a Murugan Temples throughout the world including SSVT.



TRAIL AND ROAD ETIQUETTE:

- Please remember to stay on the right side of the trail, inside the yellow dividing line. If you are walking as a group, please get to single file and give way for bikers.
- If you hear a biker's voice saying, "On your left", please move over to the right side and let them pass. It's also courteous to acknowledge bikers with a wave to let them know that you have heard them
- For safety reasons, if your kids are walking, make sure you or another adult responsible for them are with them at all time.

He will be seen as a child – Bala Murugan at hills, mountains, waterbodies and wherever the nature is preserved dancing with his peacock. His presence can be felt along Goddess Valli Devi at places where the women in hills and forests apply white mustard seeds mixed with ghee at their houses to invite the Lord. He accepts their food filled with devotion like his uncle Lord Vishnu in his Sri Rama Avatara accepted the food from Sabari.

The Vital air which keeps us alive – The Prana is - HE – Lord Skanda. Lord Siva blessed him to remove the worries of the beings in all the worlds.
