Deepavali

Sunday, November 12, 2023

Deepavali (meaning the row of lights) is celebrated in different ways in many parts of India. In Bengal, for example, it is celebrated as a Kaali Puja. In most other parts, it is celebrated by performing Lakshmi-Kubera Puja.

Skanda Shashti Festival

Monday, November 13 - Saturday, November 18, 2023
Skanda Shashti marks the triumph of Lord Subrahmanya over the evil Sura Padma. The son of Lord Siva killed the demon, Sura Padma, with His Holy Spear (Vel) and brought relief and joy to the suffering celestials and humans. Allegorically, the Vel represents the Jnaana Shakti (Power of Wisdom) of the Lord and Sura Padma, the demon of Ego and Ignorance within us. Lord Subrahmanya is hence considered to be the lord of wisdom who dispels our ego and ignorance. The devotees of Muruga (as Lord Subrahmanya is called in several parts of the world) observe austerities such as fast and mouna vratham starting from the day of Prathama Thithi to (and including) Skanda Shasti day. The Shashti Vratham begins on Monday, November 13 and ends on Saturday, November 18. Sunday, November 19 is celebrated as Devasena Kalyanam. Participation in these Archanas and

Homa is believed to ward off evil and usher in peace and prosperity.

Vaikuntha Ekadashi Celebrations

Thursday, December 21 - Friday, December 22, 2023
Vaikuntha Ekadashi is one of the most important Ekadashis of the year. On Vaikuntha Ekadashi day, the traditional practice is that devotees can enter the Vaikuntha Dwaara (a special gate to Vaikuntha) of temples. This is a special symbolic event, that signifies the belief that devotee can be closer to the God by observing special sadhanas such as fasting and remembering God on Vaikuntha Ekadashi day. In tune with this tradition, SSVT offers an opportunity for devotees to have Sameepa Darshanam (seeing the Lord at a close distance) by allowing the devotees to climb up the steps leading to Ananthapadmanabha shrine during that day. This sameepadarshanam will be available ONLY on the Vaikuntha Ekadashi day, Friday, December 22. We request all the devotees make use of this opportunity to have the special darshanam of the Lord on that day.

एकं सद्विप्रा बहुधा वदन्ति (Ekam Sat Vipraha Bahuda Vadanti) - Rig Veda (1.164.46) The truth is one; but the wise, talk of many.

The one God, in His/Her infinite compassion, takes on several forms (*Ishta Devata* – personal God) to fulfill the needs and aspirations of His/Her devotees. Sri Siva Vishnu Temple was founded on this principle of having several Ishta Devatas to meet the needs of a wide range of devotees. Worship of Ishta Devata and Kula Devata (Family Deity) is a special tradition to all Hindus. Supporting the rituals to various Deities according to one's choice and ability not only helps in maintaining this tradition, but it is recommended by the scriptures as one's duty. By supporting such activities in the temple, benefits accrue to the masses, and it sets a good example for future generations to follow.

Certain pujas are not conducive to be performed at home on a regular basis (ex. Siva Abhisheka, Padi Puja for Lord Ayyappa, or Butter Alankara for Lord Anjaneya) but are easily possible in a temple setting. Our scriptures place an emphasis on doing Pujas for the various deities on important days at the appropriate time (thithis); but due to schedules and other responsibilities, devotees may not be able to personally participate in these activities.

Supporting the worship of your Ishta Devatas on important days during the year has been made easy through the *Annual and Lifetime Sponsorship Program* at SSVT. Sponsorship of your favorite deities will ensure that Pujas are done on your behalf on special days regardless of if you are present on that day. These tax-deductible sponsorship donations are at a discount compared to sponsorship of individual programs during the course of the year. Annual sponsorships are valid for one year from the date of sponsorship. Lifetime sponsorships are valid in perpetuity and are deposited into the Sri Siva Vishnu Temple Endowment.

The Ayyappa Shrine at Sri Siva Vishnu Temple is a blessing to those living all over North America who would like to observe the Ayyappa Vratham and climb the holy 18 steps every year. Devotees who have been to Sabarimala in India but could not continue to go there due to their move to North America, consider SSVT Ayyappa Shrine as the "Sabarimala of the West." Devotees climbing 18 steps at SSVT follow the same rigorous austerities of AyyappaVratham. The 2023 - 2024 Ayyappa Mandala Makarotsavam starts on Friday November 17, 2023. Hundreds of Ayyappa devotees from all over the country, observing Ayyappa Vratam, climb the 18 Holy Steps with Irumudi to have darshan of Lord Ayyappa. The Ayyappa MANDALA PUJA is on Wednesday December 27, 2023. Due to the large number of Ayyappa devotees expected for the Mandala Puja, the Irumudi prepararation at the temple will start from 7:00 am to 8:30 am, and the trek and climbing of the 18 Holy Steps is planned from 8:30 am to 9:00 am, followed by Nirmalya Darsanam, Abhishekam, MANDALA PUJA Archana, Deeparadhana, and ANNADANAM by Devotees. The evening session will include Bhajan, Sahasranama Stotram, Deeparadhana, Athazha Puja, Seeveli with Thalapoli, Bhasmabhishekam, Harivarasanam. 

AYYAPPA MANDALA - MAKAROTSAVAM Austerities and Preparation required for the Pilgrimage to Ayyappa Sannidhi with Irumudi

Ayyappa Vratham

Devotees who wish to go to Sabarimala have to observe vratham (follow certain austerities) for one mandalam (41 days) to purify the mind and soul. On the first day of the month of Karthika/ Vrichikam (the middle of November), devotees wear the mudra maala and start the vratham.

Manthram to be chanted before wearing mudra maala

Devotees remove the mudra maala after chanting the manthram. The mudra maala and Irumudi be kept under the feet of Lord Ayyappa and used again.

"SWAMIYE SARANAM AYYAPPA"

Important austerities to be observed during vratham

- Observe Brahmacharyam during the vratham
- Always start the conversation with "Swami Saranam"
- Take shower twice daily and chant the names of Lord Ayyappa
- · Control your temper and be kind to others
- · Consume only freshly cooked vegetarian food
- Do not smoke or consume alcoholic beverages
- · Attend Puja either at the temple or wherever conducted
- Treat your body, mind and intellect as the abode of Ayyappa

How to prepare irumudi (in brief)

After performing Ayyappa Puja, fill the mudra coconut with melted ghee. If you are a Kanni Ayyappan or Kanni Maalikappuram (first timer), Guruswamy will help you to fill the mudra coconut with ghee. Mudra coconut and other Pujaitems must be placed in the front pocket of the Irumudi and the other two coconuts must be placed in the rear pocket. Always keep chanting the names of Lord Ayyappa while preparing the Irumudi. Never place the Irumudi on the floor; always place it on a towel and treat it with Bhakthi.
