Sarpabali

Thursday, February 22, 2024

Sarpabali is the worship of 54 divine snakes (including Siva's Vasuki and Vishnu's Adisesha) to ward off the bad effects of Sarpa-Dosha, to help mitigate and eradicate the problems of skin diseases, to help people in search of life partners find suitable spouses, for progeny (Putra Bhaagyam) and for the overall wellbeing of all. (Sarpa Dosha may be present due to harm done to snakes and other reptiles in the past births and due to other causes. Sarpa Dosha is recognized when all the other grahas in one's horoscope lie between Raahu and Kethu. Sarpa Dosha is often a reason for late marriages). Turmeric powder, rice, milk, coconuts, fruits and flowers are the ingredients generally brought by devotees for Sarpabali. For the ingredients to be included in the Puja, they must be given to the priest before the Puja starts. Sankalpam for the Puja (when devotees can mention to the priest the problems to be overcome or desires to be fulfilled) will begin at 6:30 pm. Sarpabali Puja will be performed in the Kerala Tantric style from 7:00 to 8:30 pm.

Maha Sivaratri morning puja will start with a Ganesha Puja, and Rudra Homa at 9:30 AM. The evening Special Pujas to Lord Siva will start at 2:30 PM (in the yaagashaala), 3:15 PM (at the Siva sannidhi), and continue until 6:30 AM, the following day - Saturday, March 9, 2024. A sanctified Siva Linga will be available for devotees to personally offer their Abhishekam throughout the night.

Entrance to the temple in the evening will be through the lower level. Dinner will be available from 6:00 PM, and coffee/tea will be available throughout the night.

Kaaradaiyaan Nombu

Wednesday, March 13, 2024

Kaaradaiyaan Nombu, or Savitri Vratham, is a Tamil observance in which the married woman prays for the well-being and long life of her husband. It is celebrated on March 13, 2024 this year, and time of breaking the fast and tie the Saradu is between 9:00 PM and 9:10 PM.

It is observed on the particular day when the transition betweeen the Tamil months Maasi and Panguni takes place. Kaaraadai is the name the a unique neivedya (holy offering) prepared on this day. Nombu means Vratam or Upavasam (fasting).

Panguni Uttiram Day

Sunday, March 24, 2024

Panguni Uttiram (the day Uttaraphalguni star occurs in the solar month of Meena) is one of the rare festivals that have significance for several deities in our temple. It is the Jayanti (day of incarnation) of Lord Ayyappa, the day that Sri Valli married Lord Subrahmanya, the day that Goddess Mahalakshmi incarnated on earth from the ocean of milk, the day Goddess Parvathi in the form of Kamakshi (or Gowri) married Lord Siva in Kanchipuram.

Annual and Lifetime Puja Sponsorship

एकं सद्विप्रा बहुधा वदन्ति (Ekam Sat Vipraha Bahuda Vadanti) - Rig Veda (1.164.46) The truth is one; but the wise, talk of many.

The one God, in His/Her infinite compassion, takes on several forms (*Ishta Devata* – personal God) to fulfill the needs and aspirations of His/Her devotees. Sri Siva Vishnu Temple was founded on this principle of having several Ishta Devatas to meet the needs of a wide range of devotees. Worship of Ishta Devata and Kula Devata (Family Deity) is a special tradition to all Hindus. Supporting the rituals to various Deities according to one's choice and ability not only helps in maintaining this tradition, but it is recommended by the scriptures as one's duty. By supporting such activities in the temple, benefits accrue to the masses, and it sets a good example for future generations to follow.

Certain pujas are not conducive to be performed at home on a regular basis (ex. Siva Abhisheka, Padi Puja for Lord Ayyappa, or Butter Alankara for Lord Anjaneya) but are easily possible in a temple setting. Our scriptures place an emphasis on doing Pujas for the various deities on important days at the appropriate time (thithis); but due to schedules and other responsibilities, devotees may not be able to personally participate in these activities.

Supporting the worship of your Ishta Devatas on important days during the year has been made easy through the *Annual and Lifetime Sponsorship Program* at SSVT. Sponsorship of your favorite deities will ensure that Pujas are done on your behalf on special days regardless of if you are present on that day. These tax-deductible sponsorship donations are at a discount compared to sponsorship of individual programs during the course of the year. Annual sponsorships are valid for one year from the date of sponsorship. Lifetime sponsorships are valid in perpetuity and are deposited into the Sri Siva Vishnu Temple Endowment.
