Maha Sivaratri

Friday, March 8, 2024

Maha Sivaratri morning puja will start with a Ganesha Puja, and Rudra Homa at 9:30 AM. The evening Special Pujas to Lord Siva will start at 2:30 PM (in the yaagashaala), 3:15 PM (at the Siva sannidhi), and continue until 6:30 AM, the following day - Saturday, March 9. A sanctified Siva Linga will be available for devotees to personally offer their Abhishekam throughout the night. Archanas will be performed every 30 minutes from 3-8 PM Friday, to Ganesha, Lakshmi and Venkateshwara, and no Car Puja will be available. Car Puja will resume on Saturday at 2PM. Archanas wille be performed every 30 minutes starting at 10 AM on Saturday to Ganesha and Siva.

Entrance to the temple in the evening will be through the lower level. Dinner will be available from 6:00 PM, and coffee/tea will be available throughout the night.

Kaaradaiyaan Nombu

Wednesday, March 13, 2024

Kaaradaiyaan Nombu, or Savitri Vratham, is a Tamil observance in which the married woman prays for the well-being and long life of her husband. It is celebrated on March 13, 2024 this year, and time of breaking the fast and tie the Saradu is between 9:00 PM and 9:10 PM.

It is observed on the particular day when the transition betweeen the Tamil months Maasi and Panguni takes place. Kaaraadai is the name the a unique neivedya (holy offering) prepared on this day. Nombu means Vratam or Upavasam (fasting).

Panguni Uttiram Day

Sunday, March 24, 2024

Panguni Uttiram (the day Uttaraphalguni star occurs in the solar month of Meena) is one of the rare festivals that have significance for several deities in our temple. It is the Jayanti (day of incarnation) of Lord Ayyappa, the day that Sri Valli married Lord Subrahmanya, the day that Goddess Mahalakshmi incarnated on earth from the ocean of milk, the day Goddess Parvathi in the form of Kamakshi (or Gowri) married Lord Siva in Kanchipuram. It is only fitting that we celebrate this festival in our temple with all the religious grandeur so that our congregation can receive the blessings of many Gods and Goddesses.

Annual and Lifetime Puja Sponsorship

एकं सद्विप्रा बहुधा वदन्ति (Ekam Sat Vipraha Bahuda Vadanti) - Rig Veda (1.164.46) The truth is one; but the wise, talk of many.

The one God, in His/Her infinite compassion, takes on several forms (*Ishta Devata* – personal God) to fulfill the needs and aspirations of His/Her devotees. Sri Siva Vishnu Temple was founded on this principle of having several Ishta Devatas to meet the needs of a wide range of devotees. Worship of Ishta Devata and Kula Devata (Family Deity) is a special tradition to all Hindus. Supporting the rituals to various Deities according to one's choice and ability not only helps in maintaining this tradition, but it is recommended by the scriptures as one's duty. By supporting such activities in the temple, benefits accrue to the masses, and it sets a good example for future generations to follow.

Certain pujas are not conducive to be performed at home on a regular basis (ex. Siva Abhisheka, Padi Puja for Lord Ayyappa, or Butter Alankara for Lord Anjaneya) but are easily possible in a temple setting. Our scriptures place an emphasis on doing Pujas for the various deities on important days at the appropriate time (thithis); but due to schedules and other responsibilities, devotees may not be able to personally participate in these activities.

Supporting the worship of your Ishta Devatas on important days during the year has been made easy through the *Annual and Lifetime Sponsorship Program* at SSVT. Sponsorship of your favorite deities will ensure that Pujas are done on your behalf on special days regardless of if you are present on that day. These tax-deductible sponsorship donations are at a discount compared to sponsorship of individual programs during the course of the year. Annual sponsorships are valid for one year from the date of sponsorship. Lifetime sponsorships are valid in perpetuity and are deposited into the Sri Siva Vishnu Temple Endowment.

Namaste Devotees!

It is great to see a good number of devotees each and every weekend at the temple - especially during a traditionally slow time of the year. SSVT belongs to the entire congregation and it is important for all devotees to play an active role in the temple operation. The best way to understand how SSVT operates and serves to a large congregation consisting of a diverse cultural and linguistic background is to be an active volunteer. On your next visit, please stop by the front desk to see if there are any areas you may be able to assist. The volunteer-led committees: Religious, Cultural, Education, Public Relations, and Kitchen Committees, falls within the Operations Committee - led by the Vice Chairperson of Operations, Smt. Maha Sivaratri (March 8-9): As you know, this annual religious puja to Lord Siva marks the remembrance of "overcoming darkness and ignorance." It is believed that a devotee who performs sincere worship of Lord Siva on the auspicious day of Sivaratri is absolved of sins and attains Moksha. As always, our staff and volunteers have made extensive arrangements to accommodate a seamless flow devotees for darshan throughout the night. Please refer to pages 6-10 for more information.

Ananthapadmanabha Mahotsavam (August 7-11): Save the Date - the first Mahotsavam for Lord Ananthapadmanabha will be this August. The religious festivities, and program events are being finalized within the next few weeks.

SSVT Sai Mandir: Demolition of the old Balalaya is scheduled for March 11-15. Following demo, the existing foundation will be inspected and may be removed and replaced depending on inspection findings. New construction for the SSVT Sai Mandir will begin soon, and we anticipate work to be completed by October 2024. We held a informative Town Hall on February 10th to update the congregation on the project progress. I presented a proposal (which is with the BOT for consideration) for a Vasavi/ Kanyaka Parameswari Idol installation on the 2nd floor of the SSVT Sai Mandir building. This town hall was held in true transparency with the congregation.

HVAC Replacement: The new equipment to serve the Maha Mandapam and Auditorium has been delivered. Decommissioning of the existing systems will begin after Sivaratri, and the new system installation will start in April. We anticipate the new HVAC systems will be commissioned this Summer.

Roof Repairs: The Engineering Committee has been tasked with replacing the old roofing system that shelters the temple today. During heavy rains, there are different areas that leak and I think we've exceeded the life span of the existing roof long enough. The committee expects a design to complete in the next couple of months, and we anticipate putting out a request for proposal by the Summer. Based on the bids we receive and if costs are reasonable, we expect to award the contract and get the roof replacement done by end of this year.






