Akshaya Trittiya

Friday, May 10, 2024

Akshaya Trittiya is Parasurama Jayanti, where Parasurama is one of the Avatars of Maha Vishnu. The word Akshaya means growth and Trittiya is the third tithi. It is believed that any ritual performed on that day leads to growth, therefore, jewelry and ornaments are bought on that day for overall prosperity. Gandha (Chandana) Alankara is traditionally performed for Lord Krishna on this day to cool the body of the Lord, so that he will bestow us all with wealth.

Sri Sankara Jayanthi Day

SSVT will be celebrating Sri Sankara Jayanthi on Sunday, May 12. The celebration will begin with a Ganesha Puja followed by Kalasa Sthapanam, Rudra (Siva) Abhisheka, and Shodasa Upachara Puja to Sri Adi Shankara. A highlight of the puja will be the chanting of Totakaashtakam and Guru Paduka Stotram.

Siva Brahmotsavam

Saturday, May 18 - Wednesday, May 22, 2024

According to both Shaiva and Vaishnava Agamas, a Brahmotsavam is considered to be the chief among the festivals conducted for the main deities of a temple. Legend says that Lord Brahma himself officiated the first utsavam to mitigate Indra's sins arising from a happenstance event. Since then, annual Brahmotsavams are carried out for both SIva and Vishnu to provide an opportunity for devotees to wash away their sins, and negativities. Even Lord Brahma and other Devas are said to visit such utsavams and bless the devotees. The word Brahma in Brahmotsavam denotes the suprement Brahman - the absolute one. By performing the Brahmotsavam, the Jeevaathmas reach the Supreme Brahman in the simplest way. The five-day annual event for Lord Siva starts on May 18th followed by special pujas for Lord Siva every day. Siva Brahmotsavam concludes on Vaikasi Vishaaka nakshatra day this year (Wednesday, May 22), a special day for His Divine Son, Lord Subrahmanya.

Vaikasi Visakam Day

Wednesday, May 22, 2024

During the month of Vaikasi (Vrishabam) the Nakshatram Vishakam generally falls on the full moon day. This day signifies the birth of Lord Subrahmanya, the second son of Lord Siva. Lord Subrahmanya was born with the mission of saving Earth from demons such as Soorapadman. He emerged as 6 sparks from the third eye of Siva, and passing through sky, wind, fire and the waters of Ganga, reached Earth, formless at first and finally acquiring form in a pond. That the Almighty comprises the five elements is demonstrated by the manifestation of Lord Subrahmanya. Lord Subrahmanya is also known by many names including as Vishaka, Senthil, Kumara, Shanmugam, Lord Karthikeya and fondly

The one God, in His/Her infinite compassion, takes on several forms (*Ishta Devata* – personal God) to fulfill the needs and aspirations of His/Her devotees. Sri Siva Vishnu Temple was founded on this principle of having several Ishta Devatas to meet the needs of a wide range of devotees. Worship of Ishta Devata and Kula Devata (Family Deity) is a special tradition to all Hindus. Supporting the rituals to various Deities according to one's choice and ability not only helps in maintaining this tradition, but it is recommended by the scriptures as one's duty. By supporting such activities in the temple, benefits accrue to the masses, and it sets a good example for future generations to follow.

Certain pujas are not conducive to be performed at home on a regular basis (ex. Siva Abhisheka, Padi Puja for Lord Ayyappa, or Butter Alankara for Lord Anjaneya) but are easily possible in a temple setting. Our scriptures place an emphasis on doing Pujas for the various deities on important days at the appropriate time (thithis); but due to schedules and other responsibilities, devotees may not be able to personally participate in these activities.

Supporting the worship of your Ishta Devatas on important days during the year has been made easy through the *Annual and Lifetime Sponsorship Program* at SSVT. Sponsorship of your favorite deities will ensure that Pujas are done on your behalf on special days regardless of if you are present on that day. These tax-deductible sponsorship donations are at a discount compared to sponsorship of individual programs during the course of the year. Annual sponsorships are valid for one year from the date of sponsorship. Lifetime sponsorships are valid in perpetuity and are deposited into the Sri Siva Vishnu Temple Endowment.

With an anticipated annual budget of \$15,000, there are opportunities for up donate for this effort. All it takes is 100 donors to step up with a \$151 donation each to fill this budget. Our temple is your temple; help us keep it beautiful all year long, so many have an enjoyable visit. Holi Celebrations (held April 7) organized by Trustee Jaishri Shankar, and the Education Committee, was a grand success! A good number of families with their children participated along with local students from area universities. Thank you to our great volunteers for treating the children with Bhel puri and Thandai

and for making it a memorable experience! With Ugadi, Vishu, Tamil, and Tulu New Year all so close in date this year (April 9 and 13th), we celebrated with much pomp and circumstance the festivities on Saturday, April 13th. All the events (Srinivasa Kalyanam, Panchanga Patanam) along with a cultural program in the evening went very well, and a large number of devotees participated! A special Kalyana Bhojanam was served on a banana leaf – over 1,000 meals were served! Special thanks to our volunteers, including the Kitchen Committee Volunteers, PR Committee, as well as the Religious and Cultural Committee

volunteers! Earlier last month, SSVT had the privilege to provide puja services, and counseling support to the crew members aboard the Klara Oldendorff cargo ship in Baltimore. SSVT Priests Sri Janakiram Marthi and Sri Rakesh Bhatt performed a puja service for those who were affected by the unfortunate Key bridge collapse in the Baltimore Harbor. Lunch was prepared by our temple cooks. Many thanks to our priests and to our partners at HACSI for supporting the community affected by the unfortunate bridge

collapse. Sri Ananthapadmanabha Vaibhava Mahotsavam (August 7-11): As I shared previously, in keeping with our temple tradition, we will be conducting a five-day grand Mahotsavam for Lord Ananthapadmanabha. Princess Gouri Parvati Bai of Travancore Royal Family, an Ananthapadmanabha sevini, will be gracing us during the occasion. She has agreed to give a keynote address during the event. Be on the look out for additional details.

HVAC Replacement Project: The old Air Handling Units (AHU) and chillers were removed and replaced with the new systems. The pumps in the Mechanical Room at the rear entrance were also installed. The contractor, ProTec, is working on piping and duct work. ProTec is doing a great job, and we anticipate the new units to be fully operational by the Summer season. It's important to highlight that we are replacing a 30-year-old system that was not operational or efficient for our temple needs. Please note the lower-level Southwest entrance (back corner of dining hall) will be closed until the installation work is complete.

The Engineering Committee is working towards replacing the old roof over the Mahamandapam and Balaji sides, and exploring options to fix the prakaram and upgrade the flooring. 



JAYA ANANTHAPADMANABHA – An Iconic Pratishta

SHANTHAM (Serenity) SOWKHYAM (Wellbeing) SHOURYAM (Courage)

This year SSVT is celebrating the Mahotsavam for Lord Anantha Padmanabha — "Sri Ananthapadmanabha Vaibhava Mahotsavam" for the first time in 40 years since the temple was founded. Modeled from the deity in the Thiruvananthapuram temple, the uniqueness of the Sannidhi is that it has - Vishnu as Ananthapadmanabha, Siva as Lingam below the Right hand, Brahma from his Nabhi in the middle up on a lotus on the wall behind along with SriDevi and BhuDevi on either side on the back wall with the representation of 33 crore+ Devtas distributed in the back wall. This Sannidhi at SSVT is the only one of its kind in the United States, and SSVT is one of only three temples in the world with this deity, the other two being in India.

Pratishta of Lord Ananthapadmanabha:

In 1992, the Anantha Padmanabha Pratishta was completed at our temple. The story of this Pratishta is fascinating, and is proof of the triumph of the human spirit over obstacles and hardships through faith in God, dedication, and the intervention of divine grace.

<u>The Creation:</u> The late Sri Ganapathy Sthapati, past Principal of College of Temple Architecture, directed the actual carving of the granite by Perumal Sthapati in Mahabalipuram. The Vigraha has 3 piece parts to it – 1) The Lord's body, which is 9.5 ft. – 11 ft. carved from a single piece of granite, (2) the Adisesha body or Snake Bed (3) the Adisesha Heads. Jaya Ananthapadmanabha!

<u>The Transportation:</u> After many months of carving, and obtaining clearances, the Vigraha was finally shipped from Chennai port. However the container landed in Seattle, Washington state, and it took a lot of effort to convince the Customs authorities there not to drill holes in the Vigraha to check for drugs and contraband goods!!!

The next difficulty was how to transport the Vigraha from Seattle to Lanaham, MD in one piece. Fortunately, one of the founder trustees worked with a trucking company conglomerate, and he managed to arrange for the shipping of the Vigraha by road on a flat-bed truck all the way to SSVT. By Divine grace, the 8 Ton Vigraha arrived intact. Jaya Ananthapadmanabha!

<u>Placing in the Garbhagruha:</u> The Engineering Committee then pondered on how to move the Vigraha inside the temple building. So a huge crane was used to lift the Vigraha to the Praakaram level i.e. 1st floor. But it still had to be brought into the Mahamandapam, and to do this, they had to widen the front entrance. The final problem was how to get it inside Garbhagruha (Sanctum Sanctorum).

The Shilpies themselves resolved the issue by enlarging the entrance to the Garbhagruha to allow the pieces inside. They staggered sandbags over the steps, placed large wooden rollers on top of the sandbags, covered by sacking all the way to the inner sanctum, and dragged the piece parts one by one into the Garbhagruha. The Shilpies explained that this is the practice they have been using over centuries to move Vigrahas, so they were adept at it - Jaya Ananthapadmanabha!

Another interesting fact is that each of the major deities in SSVT rests on a hollow structure or pillar filled with earth all the way up to the Vigraha. You can find more details in the souvenir that SSVT will publish during the Mahotsavam.

We invite all the congregation members to come and participate in this unique Mahotsavam to Sri Ananthapadmanabha and seek his blessings.









