Sarada Navaratri

Thursday, October 3 - Saturday, October 12, 2024

Sarada Navaratri, as it is called since it occurs during the fall season (Sharad Ritu) is one of the most popular Hindu festivals spanning a period of nine nights. The Goddess in the form of the Universal Mother is commonly worshiped during the nine nights and ten days and hence it is also known by the name of Devi Navaratri. Three aspects of the Divine Mother, namely Durga, Lakshmi and Saraswati are worshiped during the nine nights, the tenth day being celebrated as Vijaya Dasami. It is considered auspicious to start new ventures, especially in the field of education, on Vijaya Dasami. Reading the Durga Sapta Shati (also known as Devi Mahaatmyam) and Ramayanam is also common during the Navaratri. Special Pujas are scheduled in the temple during the ten days. Devotees are encouraged to participate personally in the Sahasranama Archana daily. (Sponsorship is not a requirement for participation in this archana)

Skanda Shashti Festival

Friday November 1 - Wednesday, November 6, 2024 Skanda Shashti marks the triumph of Lord Subrahmanya over the evil Sura Padma. The son of Lord Siva killed the demon, Sura Padma, with His Holy Spear (Vel) and brought relief and joy to the suffering celestials and humans. Allegorically, the Vel represents the Jnaana Shakti (Power of Wisdom) of the Lord and Sura Padma, the demon of Ego and Ignorance within us. Lord Subrahmanya is hence considered to be the lord of wisdom who dispels our ego and ignorance. The devotees of Muruga (as Lord Subrahmanya is called in several parts of the world) observe austerities such as fast and mouna vratham starting from the day of Prathama Thithi to (and including) Skanda Shasti day. The Shashti Vratham begins on Monday, November 13 and ends on Saturday, November 18. Sunday, November 19 is celebrated as Devasena Kalyanam. Participation in these Archanas and Homa is believed to ward off evil and usher in peace and prosperity.

The one God, in His/Her infinite compassion, takes on several forms (*Ishta Devata* – personal God) to fulfill the needs and aspirations of His/Her devotees. Sri Siva Vishnu Temple was founded on this principle of having several Ishta Devatas to meet the needs of a wide range of devotees. Worship of Ishta Devata and Kula Devata (Family Deity) is a special tradition to all Hindus. Supporting the rituals to various Deities according to one's choice and ability not only helps in maintaining this tradition, but it is recommended by the scriptures as one's duty. By supporting such activities in the temple, benefits accrue to the masses, and it sets a good example for future generations to follow.

Certain pujas are not conducive to be performed at home on a regular basis (ex. Siva Abhisheka, Padi Puja for Lord Ayyappa, or Butter Alankara for Lord Anjaneya) but are easily possible in a temple setting. Our scriptures place an emphasis on doing Pujas for the various deities on important days at the appropriate time (thithis); but due to schedules and other responsibilities, devotees may not be able to personally participate in these activities.

Supporting the worship of your Ishta Devatas on important days during the year has been made easy through the *Annual and Lifetime Sponsorship Program* at SSVT. Sponsorship of your favorite deities will ensure that Pujas are done on your behalf on special days regardless of if you are present on that day. These tax-deductible sponsorship donations are at a discount compared to sponsorship of individual programs during the course of the year. Annual sponsorships are valid for one year from the date of sponsorship. Lifetime sponsorships are valid in perpetuity and are deposited into the Sri Siva Vishnu Temple Endowment.

Chairperson's Corner

Namaste Devotees!

With schools back in session for a few weeks now, and many of you back from vacation, it is reassuring to see the congregation visiting our temple and participating in various pujas and events. After the successful "Ananthapadmanabha Vaibhava Mahotsavam," our temple continues to celebrate our annual pujas like Upakarma, Varalakshmi Vratam, and Sravana Somavara Siva Abhishekas with great pomp and fervor. We ended August with a well attended Krishna Janmashtami puja, and started September with the 10th Annual Build Your Own Ganesha (BYOG) - with participation of over 350 children and their families this year as to celebrate the start of the new school year and seek Lord Ganesha's blessings. Sahasramodhaka homam was another highlight event, which paved the way for Onam celebrations with a stunning Pookalam. The vibrant colors and intricate design truly capture the essence of Onam; symbolizing joy, unity, and prosperity. Onam Sadhya was the highlight of the day. Over 900 devotees were served a very special Sadhya (typical Kerala style food items prepared by our cooks) by Kitchen committee and PR committee volunteers.

As we look towards Fall season, there are many religious events and celebrations to look forward to including Sarada Navaratri, Kartika Somvara, Deepavali, Skanda Sashti, and the start to Avvappa Mandala season.

The HVAC replacement project is in the final stages of completion; it was very timely to have the cooling systems completed earlier this year for the Summer. On the SSVT Sai Mandir project, we have been working with WSSC (water utility provider) on the water and sewer connections and site plans. The plumbing permit is anticipated by October, and building construction will resume. With the selection of the building furnishings underway, we consulted our Asthana Stapathi regarding placing the Sai Baba murti on a raised platform (Peetam) and prabhavali design. Additionally, we are in conversation with Stapathi regarding the design and manufacture of Vasavi Mata (Kannika Parameswari) Sannidhi and Vigraha. He has provided the layouts and detailed drawings for these.

For the main temple, the design of the upper level roof replacement and prakaram repair projects are underway with a professional engineering firm. Bid and construction for these improvements are expected in the next three to six months. In addition, renovation of the auditorium, dining hall and the restrooms will be the primary projects we will complete in 2025.

Our annual fundraiser will be held on Saturday, November 9th, returning to an in-person event at Eleanor Roosevelt High School auditorium in Greenbelt Maryland. Headlining the program will be Vijay TV Supersingers featuring Madhan's band - ready to provide an exciting evening of entertaining. The live music performances will be followed by a catered dinner. Please check out our website, our social media sites and WhatsApp community for more information.

Also coming up in November will be a first ever Career Fair for local college students to find internship and full-time employment opportunities with local employers. It will be held in the temple Auditorium and more details will be shared once finalized. Please consider a charitable contribution to our temple – to help with our capital improvement projects, or for our operations, or to the endowment.
