Sarpabali

Tuesday, March 11, 2025

Sarpabali is the worship of 54 divine names (including Siva's Vasuki, and Vishnu's Adisesha) to ward off bad effects of Sarpa Dosha, help mitigate and eradicate skin diseases, help people search for life partners, for progeny, and the overall well-being of all. Sarpa Dosha is recognized when all the other grahas in one's horoscope lie between Raahu and Kethu. It is often a reason for late marriages. Turmeric powder, rice, milk, coconuts, fruits and flowers are the ingredients generally brought by devotees for Sarpabali.

Kaaradaiyaan Nombu

Friday, March 14, 2025

Kaaradaiyaan Nombu, or Savitri Vratham, is a Tamil observance in which the married woman prays for the well-being and long life of her husband. It is celebrated on March 14, 2025 this year, and time of breaking the fast and tie the Saradu is between 9:15 AM and 9:20 AM.

It is observed on the particular day when the transition betweeen the Tamil months Maasi and Panguni takes place. Kaaraadai is the name the a unique neivedya (holy offering) prepared on this day. Nombu means Vratam or Upavasam (fasting).

On March 29th Sani transitions from Kumbha to Meena Rasi. Sani is often associated with discipline, responsibility, karma and lessons learned through challenges and its transit is a significant astrological event.

Vasantha Navaratri

Saturday, March 29 to Sunday, April 6, 2025

Navaratris are important festival days for Goddess Devi (the Divine Mother). Goddess Devi, who appears in the fierce (Ugram) form (to destroy our sins) in the autumn season, appears in a peaceful, and benevolent form in the Spring. By worshiping Her during the two Navaratris, one destroys their sins and begets peace and properity.

The one God, in His/Her infinite compassion, takes on several forms (*Ishta Devata* – personal God) to fulfill the needs and aspirations of His/Her devotees. Sri Siva Vishnu Temple was founded on this principle of having several Ishta Devatas to meet the needs of a wide range of devotees. Worship of Ishta Devata and Kula Devata (Family Deity) is a special tradition to all Hindus. Supporting the rituals to various Deities according to one's choice and ability not only helps in maintaining this tradition, but it is recommended by the scriptures as one's duty. By supporting such activities in the temple, benefits accrue to the masses, and it sets a good example for future generations to follow.

Certain pujas are not conducive to be performed at home on a regular basis (ex. Siva Abhisheka, Padi Puja for Lord Ayyappa, or Butter Alankara for Lord Anjaneya) but are easily possible in a temple setting. Our scriptures place an emphasis on doing Pujas for the various deities on important days at the appropriate time (tithis); but due to schedules and other responsibilities, devotees may not be able to personally participate in these activities.

Supporting the worship of your Ishta Devatas on important days during the year has been made easy through the *Annual and Lifetime Sponsorship Program* at SSVT. Sponsorship of your favorite deities will ensure that Pujas are done on your behalf on special days regardless of if you are present on that day. These tax-deductible sponsorship donations are valid for one year from the date of sponsorship. Lifetime sponsorships are valid in perpetuity and are deposited into the Sri Siva Vishnu Temple Endowment.

Chairperson's Corner

Namaste Devotees,

On behalf of the Board of Trustees (BOT), I wish to thank all the devotees who visited our temple in the first two months of 2025! February, though typically a lean month, saw big crowds for Thai Poosam, Madhava Navami celebrations. Maha Sivarathri saw a huge crowd throughout the day and night. Learning from our recent experience, our team planned well for this occasion, with adequate parking, food, viewing experience, and security. Our priests deserve special praise for the preparation and the beautiful Siva alankaram, for Shodasaupacharams and Veda parayanam. Neivedyam Acharya deserves special mention for preparing neivedyam for all the 4 kaalaas. My special thanks to all of you for taking the time to visit the temple and all our staff and volunteers who helped us to make Sivarathri a great night to remember.

We have started planning our **Annual Mahotsavam - Siva Gnana Deepika (Mahotsavam for Lord Ramanathaswamy)**. We are consultation with our Pradhana Sivachariyar, who will preside over the event, to hold this Mahotsavam from July 25 to August 3, 2025 - save the date! Upon finalizing the religious program, and in consultation with our Acharyas and Sivachariyar, we will form a Task Force and share the program details with all devotees.

Looking ahead, we have Sarpa Bali (which falls on Kumbha Masa Aslesha Nakshatra) on March 11, Ugadi Day and Celebrations on March 29, and Chandi Homam conducted by our temple, as part of Vasantha Navaratri.

The SSVT Sai Mandir construction is progressing well. The Vasavi Matha Vigraha is complete and the silver kavacha and prabhavali fabrication is expected to be completed and shipped by mid-March. We also inspected the Sai Baba murthy, which has been in storage over the last couple of years and made sure it is intact.

The Engineering Committee has done a fantastic job to upgrade life safety systems throughout the temple. The sprinkler heads have been replaced, and the fire alarm system upgrade is awaiting permit approval from the county. Given the age of the Maha Mandapam and Balaji roof, we have significant roof leaks at many locations. The BOT has decided to proceed with the roof replacement project. This contract is out for bid, and we hope to have the bid process completed and a contractor on boarded by the end of March. The roof replacement is expected for this Summer, with Prakaram repairs to follow soon. These improvements cost a significant amount - I appeal to you to consider making a tax-deductible contribution for these infrastructure projects.

The long awaited career fair for local college students will be held on March 23 from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM. This is an opportunity for college students to gain internship experience for the Summer 2025 as well as full time opportunities. 



(Sarpa Dosha may be present due to harm done to snakes and other reptiles in the past births and due to other causes. Sarpa Dosha is recognized when all the other grahas in one's horoscope lie between Raahu and Kethu. SarpaDosha is often a reason for late marriages). Turmeric powder, rice, milk, coconuts, fruits and flowers are the ingredients generally brought by devotees for Sarpabali. For the ingredients to be included in the Puja, they must be given to the priest before the Puja starts. Sankalpam for the Puja (when devotees can mention to the priest the problems to be overcome or desires to be fulfilled) will begin at 6:30 pm. Sarpabali Puja will be performed in the Kerala Tantric style from 7:00 to 8:30 pm.




