The one God, in His/Her infinite compassion, takes on several forms (*Ishta Devata* – personal God) to fulfill the needs and aspirations of His/Her devotees. Sri Siva Vishnu Temple was founded on this principle of having several Ishta Devatas to meet the needs of a wide range of devotees. Worship of Ishta Devata and Kula Devata (Family Deity) is a special tradition to all Hindus. Supporting the rituals to various Deities according to one's choice and ability not only helps in maintaining this tradition, but it is recommended by the scriptures as one's duty. By supporting such activities in the temple, benefits accrue to the masses, and it sets a good example for future generations to follow.

Certain pujas are not conducive to be performed at home on a regular basis (ex. Siva Abhisheka, Padi Puja for Lord Ayyappa, or Butter Alankara for Lord Anjaneya) but are easily possible in a temple setting. Our scriptures place an emphasis on doing Pujas for the various deities on important days at the appropriate time (tithis); but due to schedules and other responsibilities, devotees may not be able to personally participate in these activities.

Supporting the worship of your Ishta Devatas on important days during the year has been made easy through the *Annual and Lifetime Sponsorship Program* at SSVT. Sponsorship of your favorite deities will ensure that Pujas are done on your behalf on special days regardless of if you are present on that day. These tax-deductible sponsorship donations are valid for one year from the date of sponsorship. Lifetime sponsorships are valid in perpetuity and are deposited into the Sri Siva Vishnu Temple Endowment.

Chairperson's Corner

Namaste Devotees,

On behalf of the Board of Trustees (BOT), I wish to thank all the devotees who visited and participated in our temple events over the last couple of months.

At the end of March, we celebrated Ugadi which included our first Ugadi Bhojanam for devotees. Over 1,100 devotees participated in the Sadhya, making this a grand success. A week later, as part of Sri Rama Navami, our priests performed Sita Rama Kalyanam with over 250 devotees in attendance. This year, Panguni Uttiram was also well attended by devotees - thank you all for your partcipation!

Sri Shanmukha Sivacharyar, our Asthana Sivachryar, visited SSVT, from April 11 – April 14 to give Deeksha to participating devotees so they can start the nama japa as part of the Sri Siva Gnana Deepika Mahotsavam. He also gave Deeksha to our Saiva acharyas so they can chant Siva moola mantra that can be offered during the homam during Mahotsavam. During his visit, we finalized the religious program details along with Vastram, samagriyai requirements. Please check the SSVT website, WhatsApp, and email messages with the Mahotsavam and Sponsorship details.

Tamil, Tulu and Vishu celebrations went off well with Siva Parvathi Kalyanam, and Vishu Kanai well done. The Sadhya on covering both New Year's Day celebrations was well attended with over 750 devotees taking part in Sadhya / Ayyappa Padi Puja.

Looking ahead, we have Shankara Jayanthi, Ramanuja Jayanthi coming up on May 1 and Basava Jayanthi celebration on May 3rd. Food Bazaar is on May 10th and Meenakshi Kalyanam on May 11th. Venkateswara Brahmotsavam starts on May 21st. and Hanumat Jayanthi on May 22nd. In June, we will celebrate Siva Brahmotsavam and Vikasi Visakham. Please plan your visits accordingly.

The SSVT Sai Mandir construction is progressing well. Framing, roofing and waterproofing the exterior is almost complete. Interior Mechanical, Electrical and Plumbing work will be starting shortly The Vasavi Matha Vigraha is complete and has been shipped from Chennai We expect it to arrive at the Baltimore port by the end of May. The silver kavacha and prabhavali fabrication is expected to be completed soon.

The Engineering Committee has done a fantastic job to upgrade life safety systems throughout the temple. We obtained the required permits to upgrade the (original) fire alarm system, and we expect this upgrade to be completed in the next 4-6 weeks. The bid process for the Mahamandapam and Balaji roof replacement contract has been completed and the contract was signed with DJB Roofing. This project will replace the original roof (35 and 30 years old) over these areas. Work will start early May and will be completed by mid-July. The roof project will cost approximately \$600,000. Prakaram repairs are under design and will be out for contractor bids soon. Please donate generously to support these essential and safety critical projects.

Siva Brahmotsavam

Wednesday, June 4 - Sunday, June 8, 2025

According to both Shaiva and Vaishnava Agamas, a Brahmotsavam is considered to be the chief among the festivals conducted for the main deities of a temple. Legend says that Lord Brahma himself officiated the first utsavam to mitigate Indra's sins arising from a happenstance event. Since then, annual Brahmotsavams are carried out for both Siva and Vishnu to enable the devotees to wash away their sins and negativities. Even Lord Brahma and other Devas are said to visit such utsavams and bless the devotees. The word Brahma in Brahmotsavam, denotes the supreme Brahman - the absolute one. By performing the Brahmotsavam, the Jeevaathmas reach the Supreme Brahman in the simplest way. Siva Brahmotsavam concludes on Vaikasi Vishaaka nakshatra day this year (Sunday, June 8), a special day for His Divine Son, Lord Subrahmanya.

Vaikasi Visakam Day

Sunday, June 8, 2025

During the month of Vaikasi (Vrishabam) the Nakshatram Vishakam generally falls on the full moon day. This day signifies the birth of Lord Subrahmanya, the second son of Lord Siva. Lord Subrahmanya was born with the mission of saving earth from demons such as Soorapadman. He emerged as 6 sparks from the third eye of Siva, and passed through sky, wind, fire and the waters of Ganga, reached Earth, formless at first and finally acquiring form in a pond. That the Almighty comprises the five elements is demonstrated by the manifestation of Lord Subrahmanya. Lord Subrahmanya is also known by many names including as Vishaka, Senthil, Kumara, Shanmugam, Lord Karthikeya and fondly as Muruga. Lord Murugan has six faces and because of that He is also known as Lord Arumugam. Due to His six faces Lord Murugan can see in East, West, North, South, Heaven and Patala

(netherworld) simultaneously. Vaikasi Visakam is celebrated with much religious importance and fervor at the Arupadaiveedu of Lord Muruga or the six abodes of Lord Murugan in Tamil Nadu. These temples are the Pazhani Hill Temple in Pazhani, Thiruchendur Murugan Temple at Tiruchendur, Arulmigu Swaminatha Swami Temple at Swamimalai, Thiruthani Murugan Temple, Sri Subramanya Temple at Pazhamudircholai, and Thiruparamkundram Subramanya Swamy Temple. It is also celebrated in many a Murugan Temple throughout the world including SSVT.





Did vou know?

The SSVT vibrant flower garden, traditionally known as a Nandavanam, is an integral part to our daily rituals!

As is the practice at many temples, fresh flowers from our very own garden are lovingly offered to our temple deities each day! The journey of our Nandavanam began humbly in early 1990 with a small collection of roses and mums. The initial aspiration was simple – to have at least one flower available from our garden for the daily puja!

Over the years, especially over the last three to four years, the garden has truly blossomed and expanded significantly because of the efforts of a dedicated group of knowledgeable volunteers. Our current goal is to cultivate a garden that offers flowers throughout the year, taking a brief pause only during the winter, dormant growing season.

The team has focused on planting special flora that hold significance in our traditions, such as Bilvam, Durva grass (arugampul), Thulasi (holy basil), Arabian Jasmine, Lotus, Jasmine (mullai), and even banana plants.

Our garden provides a seasonal tapestry of colors and fragrances:

- ➤ Winter/Early Spring: Camelia, Daffodil
- > Spring: Snowball Viburnum, Peonies
- Summer: Roses, Hydrangeas, Southern Magnolia, Hibiscus, Jasmine (mullai), Lotus
- ➤ Fall: Dahlias, Mums

To protect them from the colder temperatures, some of our more delicate plants and flowers are brought indoors


Through the grace of God, and the selfless contributions of our dedicated volunteers, the serene beauty and fragrant offerings of the temple garden are a joy for everyone to experience!

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
